What: This Saturday evening, January 22nd, the community is invited to a free event at Caribbean Gardens to discover how we can all help preserve the Florida we've come to love – for our time and future generations. Presenting at the zoo this Saturday evening will be the Florida Wildlife Federation. Since 1937, FWF has worked for the citizens of Florida to keep the balance of nature by providing a place for people as well as preserving natural areas that we depend on for our lifestyle -- from fresh drinking water to clean beaches and rivers.

By working with communities and at the state level, FWF represents all of us concerned about poorly planned growth, proper management of fresh and salt water resources, as well as state forests. FWF encourages outdoor education in our schools and supports traditional outdoor recreation for all of us including fishing, hunting, canoeing, hiking, bird watching, and photography. FWF was instrumental in the 1942 creation of today's Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. FWF also drafted the legislation for Florida's Conservation and Recreational Lands program which has provided thousands of acres for Floridians to enjoy as well as providing a safe place for wildlife.

Presenters include noted Florida conservationist Franklin Adams, FWF president Manley Fuller, and SW FL Field Representative Nancy Payton. The evening will also feature an animal presentation in the Safari Canyon theater featuring zoo director David Tetzlaff. Come see how you can be a part of insuring the future of natural areas for people and wildlife in the next generation.
