Passport & Visa Info www.traveldocs.com

- U.S. Citizens need a passport valid for at least 7 months beyond completion of the tour.
- A visa is required for Kenya and Tanzania. We recommend Zierer Visa Service who will charge a fee for visas. Fees will be listed on visa paperwork. www.zvs.com
- Non-US citizens should contact the consulates of tour countries to determine if a visa is required.

Electric Current

- All Serena Properties have 24 hours of power. All camcorders & digital cameras can be charged at the guest's convenience.
- Voltage in the lodges is 220 – 240 V. If you plan on bringing electrical devices with you, it is suggested that you bring an electrical converter, with adapter plug set. The socket configurations vary between the two and three-pronged variety, so please bring the entire set of adapters.

Clothing & Packing

- Comfortable and casual clothing is recommended while on this itinerary. For daytime and evening wear, including the Welcome and Farewell receptions and dinners, casual dress is recommended. Formal attire is not required.
- Generally, during the day, lightweight cotton shirts, skirts, pants and shorts are sufficient. A windbreaker is suggested along with fleece or other layers of clothing for cooler temperatures during early morning game drives and evenings.
- Game drives can be dusty, so wear something that

can be washed while on tour. While dry cleaning service is not available, the hotels and lodges we stay in throughout the safari portion of our itinerary have valet laundry and pressing available for an additional charge.

- As intra tour flights have luggage restrictions, please pack light and bring only one average sized piece of luggage in addition to your duffel.
- While on safari, it is recommended you wear natural earth-colored clothing, such as khakis, tans, browns and greens, as well as comfortable walking shoes or sneakers.
- A personal medical kit with the medication for possible upset stomach, aspirin and allergy medicine may also be useful. Please bring an extra pair of prescription glasses or contact lenses. If you are taking prescription drugs, bring a prescription signed by your doctor, should you need an emergency refill. We recommend that you pack your prescription medicines (an adequate supply to last through your journey) along with your travel documents and a change of clothing in your carry-on bags in the event that your flight is delayed or the airline loses your luggage.
- Bring a swimsuit, hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and lip protection.
- Insect repellent with DEET is an important item to take. Pre-moistened towelettes will also be useful while on safari.
- Bring a pair of good binoculars to optimize your wildlife viewing.
- We recommend that you leave jewelry, expensive watches, and valuables at home, as safe deposit boxes are scarce during our travels.
